What Funded by HUD section 811 program, Northwest Estates II is the second phase of an affordable housing project for people with mental illness in Grant County. The project will have 17 one and two bedroom apartments and is sponsored by Community Frameworks in partnership with Grant Mental Healthcare.

Where Moses Lake, Washington

Key Facts The new construction project features:

Units with air conditioning, energy star appliances, off-street parking and washer and dryer hookups.

Nine fully assessable or adaptable apartments.

Grant Mental Healthcare will provide mental health and resident support services for residents.

Tenants will pay 30% of their income in rent and HUD will provide operating subsidies.

Funders HUD 811 Capital Advance, WA State Housing Trust Fund, Grant County and sponsor equity.
